Today I would like to share with you a story about two horses.

From a distance, both horses looked alike.

But if you get a closer look you will notice something quite interesting...

One of the horses is blind.

His owner has chosen not to have him put down, but has made him a safe and comfortable barn to live in.

If you stand nearby and listen, you will hear the sound of a bell. It is coming from a smaller horse in the field.

Attached to the horse's halter is a small, copper-colored bell. It lets the blind friend know where the other horse is, so he can follow.

As you stand and watch these two friends you'll see that the horse with the bell is always checking on the blind horse, and that the blind horse will listen for the bell and then slowly walk to where the other horse is, trusting he will not be led astray.

When the horse with the bell returns to the shelter of the barn each evening, he will stop occasionally to look back, making sure that the blind friend isn't too far behind to hear the bell.

Sometimes we are the blind horse, being guided by the little ringing bell of those who are in our lives. Like our parents, grandparents, teachers and good friends. Some walk beside us: some give us footsteps to follow in.

And at other times we are the guide horse, helping others to find their way. An act of kindness takes only a moment, but its memory can last a lifetime.

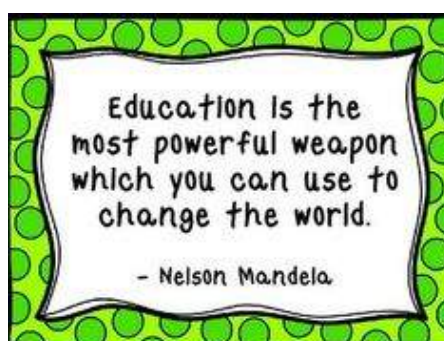
MRS. KUMARI GRERO THE NEW HEAD OF TISSL

SCHOOL DROP OFF RULES

Please help in the following ways to ease off the traffic congestion near the school entrances / gates. All parents are kindly requested to ensure that children,

- * bid good-bye to parents at home.
- * are seated on the left side of the vehicle (in order to get down quickly.)
- * have their bag and bottle ready in hand.

When dropping your child at Gate 1 on Raymond Road, please ensure the following:

- * take your vehicle close to the T-Junction beyond the gate and then drop your child.
- * stop the car in the designated area and not right in front of the gate.
- * refrain from dropping them right in front of the gate if there is room to move forward and stop.

If your child is in grades 6 - 12:

- * allow him/her to walk to school if you reside close by.
- * drop him/her off a little further away from the school entrance so that he/she only has to walk a short distance to school.
