Heroism comes from within



Does a hero have superpowers? Is he handsome? When we think of heroes, we imagine someone in a costume. Other times, we imagine it to be a man with an incredible physique and superhuman strength. True heroes are nothing of the sort.

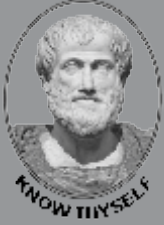
In 2009, an 11 year old girl began blogging on BBC Urdu about the takeover, by a group of extremists, of her hometown, under the pseudonym Gul Makai. The extremists denied a girls' right to go to school. Her classmates began dropping out for fear of becoming targets. An impending ban on girls in schools looked highly possible as the schools closed for winter vacation. Schools were closed for several months in her area. However, she did manage to return to school but continued to claim the Right to Education for girls. By this time, her identity had been revealed to the whole nation.

On October 9th 2012, a gunman boarded her school bus and shot her in the head. She was in critical condition. The girl survived and showed amazing bravery and optimism on her road to recovery from intricate surgery, a cochlear implant in her brain and a titanium plate in her skull.

She later took her campaign global, as a girls' education activist. The whole world knew her name: Malala Yousafzai.

A symbol for girls' Right to Education and an international symbol of peace, she was awarded the National Peace Prize in her country. In October 2014, Malala received the Nobel Peace Prize, along with Indian children's rights activist Kailash Satyarthi. At age 17, Malala was the youngest person to ever receive the Nobel Peace Prize.

She was just an ordinary girl. She felt fear just like you and I. But she knew that standing up for what was right was more important than giving in to fear. What do you believe? What will you stand up for today?

School Fees : Online

School fees should be paid a week before the term commences. A surcharge will be levied if school fees are not paid after the 1st month. Therefore, please pay your fees in time to avoid the surcharge. In case you have not received your paying-in voucher or have misplaced it, please collect a copy from the General Office. If you wish to pay fees online, please follow the instructions below when making a payment. Instructions for online payments:

1. Go to www.lyceum.lk.
2. Click on the "Login" menu option, to access the login screen.
3. Enter your username and the password; select the branch and click on the "Go" button to go to the parents' page of the Lyceum website.
4. If you have not obtained the web access passwords, you may either- send an email to it@lyceum.lk via the email address you have given to the Registrar or visit the IT. department (after school or on Parent-Teacher days) with the child's SRB and obtain the password.
5. After you access the Parents' page of the website, click on the "Know About Your Child" link.
6. In the new window, click on the "Payment Due" button in front of your child's name. (Click on the "Payment History" button to obtain a receipt after making the payment.)
7. Enter your credit card details and follow the instructions.

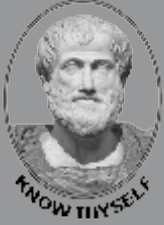

- * Payments should be made to the General Office and a receipt obtained. The report or certificate will be issued only on submission of the receipt to the School office.

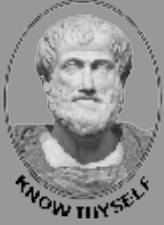
National Schools' Games - Swimming

Personal Grooming Hair

* **Boys** should cut their hair at an even length and comb it with a side part.

* **Girls** must comb hair neatly. Hair below shoulder length should be plaited tight and neat. No french braids (Grades 1 to 8 is two plaits). If the hair is layered and cannot be tied neatly please cut it in a suitable short manner. Please note that layered hair styles are not allowed. Students are also not allowed to have "bumps" in front. We will be compelled to send them home if they are unable to follow school rules and expectations regarding personal grooming.

Religion Card

Religion Card have to be submitted to the class teacher by the 1st of March 2017 ie. attendance at Religious School.

Absent in Class
